General Membership Dinner Meeting – August 22

We had an unexpectedly interesting evening last Thursday. Linda had secured Meg Howdy, Executive Director, Washington Harbor District Alliance/Harbor District Market as our speaker. However, illness prevented Meg from joining us.

We were fortunate to have one of our newest members, Doreen Trottier, stepping up at the last minute to deliver a presentation relating to The Open Door Women's Shelter in Washington. The mission of the Shelter is to assist homeless single women and women with children stable housing while getting them resources in the community to ensure long-term stable housing. This allows the families to become self-sufficient and independent while striving for a better quality of life of their own choosing. The Community Center offers washing and drying machines, a playground for the children, food and different resources to make sure the people who visit will succeed after they leave.



Doreen is the Fundraising & Outreach Chair for the Shelter located at 1240 Cowell Farm Road, Washington near the hospital. She shared they have a 9-bed facility providing safety, food, shelter and assistance from 20-25 volunteers; 6 part-time employees and 13 board members. The Center has served approximately 175 women and children since January 2019.

Doreen is involved in an expansion campaign for the shelter, *Changing Lives One Brick at a Time*. They have received a loan from NC Housing Financial Agency that will cover 70% of construction costs. Open Door Woman's Shelter must raise the other funds. Currently they have been successful in raising \$115,000 with a need to reach \$200,000 for groundbreaking of the planned 3,000 square foot, 24-bed building including dorm rooms and family rooms. Capital Campaign continues to raise the remaining funds.

Open Door Woman's Shelter will have a fund-raising dinner, dance & auction at Southern Acres in Bath, NC on September 21st. Tickets for the dinner dance are \$75 per person, with only a limited number left. They also have 50/50 raffle tickets at \$100 per ticket until 9/18 with only 200 tickets being sold. The drawing for the 50/50 will be 9/21 and the winner is guaranteed \$10,000 less \$2,500 in taxes that will be withheld. Tips for Towed Sports Safety

The summer is in full swing, which makes the topic of our safety message today even more urgent

 Towed Sports Safety. As our waterways become crowded during this time of year, it is vital to identify and implement important measures for safely water skiing, wake boarding, knee boarding, wake surfing, and tubing.

Videos like this one underscore the need for safety considerations when participating in towed sports. Did you know that according to the Coast Guard, towed water sports account for over 400 boating incidents per year.



And let's not forget your life jacket when you're out having fun on the water. In addition to a properly fitted life jacket, get one designed for the type of towed sport you are enjoying.

These measures are presented in the "Towed Sports Safety" video where viewers learn about proper equipment selection and preparing to tow a person. For instance, tube ropes should be around 60 feet long and heavier than water ski and wake board ropes that should be about 75



feet long. Also, ski ropes should have more give than wake board ropes. Additionally, the video features tips for operating underway.
